CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 3:35 p.m. by Cheryl O'Donnell. Meeting was conducted via Zoom due to the shelter-in-place order.

ACTION ITEMS:

- 1. Approval of Agenda: The 11.09.2020 agenda was approved as written.
- 2. Approval of Minutes: Minutes for the 10/26/20 meeting were approved.
- 3. Approval of CC Assessment Rubric Elements: The identified assessment elements for the six Core Competency/GE Assessment Rubrics were approved unanimously with the understanding that there will be more elements to be defined for the Communication rubric, which will address Oral Communication and other forms beyond written. The list of elements for all six rubrics can be found at the end of the minutes.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

1. Online Assessment Workshop Opportunities for Spring 2021 Semester

a. Cheryl and Guy attended a Professional Development Committee meeting on Monday, November 2 where the flex days agenda was discussed. The agenda for spring flex days is already pretty full and it did not appear that there was an opening for a breakout session on how to do online assessment. Cheryl will reach out to the PDC and see if there will be an opportunity or not. Regardless of this, the committee can look into other ways such as using a Canvas shell to be used in conjunction with a workshop on assessment.

2. Presentation of PPA Questions for 2020 – 2021 Year

a. Dave presented the PPA template for the current academic year and reviewed the questions with the committee members. This PPA will be the 1st year of the four-year cycle that was approved by Senate last year. It involves a comprehensive review of the individual program including examining some achievement data using a new data metrics tool developed by the research office.

3. Report Out on 1st Call To Action Task Force Meeting

- a. Guy reported out on the first meeting for the Task Force. The first meeting was held on Friday, November 6. There are 15 people serving on the Task Force on Race and Equity. Guy reported that Dr. Rodriguez attended and gave an example of a college in Canada, Centennial College, who developed a <u>book of commitments</u> that they made to their students. Dr. Rodriguez indicated four things he thinks the Task Force should be doing:
 - i. Review the Centennial College model/book of commitments to serve as a guide for the work to be done
 - ii. Create an equity index (USC model)
 - iii. Review the Vision of Success from the Chancellor's Office
 - iv. Host forums to promote the message
