PDC Approvals and Requests for September 2021

#1: Mercedes del Real, Counseling – Flex Course Approval and Development Approval

I am interested in facilitating a Flex Approved workshop for my peers to be able to earn Flex Credit for participating.

I believe that it would make a great professional development activity not just for my counseling colleagues, but for faculty in all disciplines. I often get emails from other faculty/ coaches who are working with their transfer students on the CSU application and have questions about certain sections of the application. Every fall we assist from 400-500 transfer applicants via our Transfer and Career Center application help sessions between October-November.

My goal is to provide a **2 hour training** at the end of this month that will include access to creating a dummy CSU application account where faculty will have the opportunity to preview and go through the actual application, with the **option for faculty to obtain up to 6 hours of flex credit** if they choose to volunteer in 2 Virtual Transfer Application Workshops for 2 hours each.

"Transfer Tuesday" workshops will be held in the morning from 9:30-12:30, and evening from 3:00-6:00. Faculty can opt to join in to help for 4 hours within those times to earn a total of 6 flex credit hours. I will request they commit their time in 2 hour blocks--so they will be able to do 4 hours in Tuesday if they choose to help both, morning and afternoon. If they can only commit to a morning vs an afternoon, they will be able to earn a total of 4 flex credit hours, or 6 flex credit hours if they volunteer two mornings (or two afternoons).

Again, in the past we've generally assisted 400-500 students in these workshops.

So, faculty can choose to take the 2 hour training for flex time to be able to assist students on their own, or choose to do the 2 hour training and join our Transfer Tuesday workshops as volunteers (1 or 2 times) obtaining 2 additional flex credit hours for each workshop they serve on. I hope this makes sense.

I would like to offer the training on Friday, September 24th before the CSU transfer application opens on October 1st.

I hope this is enough information for you to make a decision on this activity. Please let me know if you have any additional questions.
